Here is a snapshot of some of the ways we have made an impact this year:

## Moldova Sponsorships

The Moldova Student Sponsorship Program provides financial support to young adults so they can live on their own and attend university or vocational school. Sponsors provide financial support to pay for basic living expenses while the student is enrolled in school. The support these students receive is more than financial. They receive encouragement knowing someone believes in them! This year, our sponsors donated \$23,935 to students enrolled in our Moldova Sponsorship program.

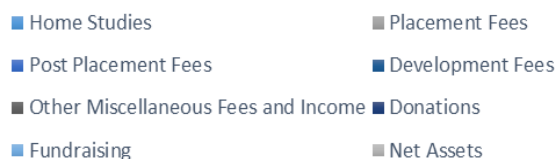
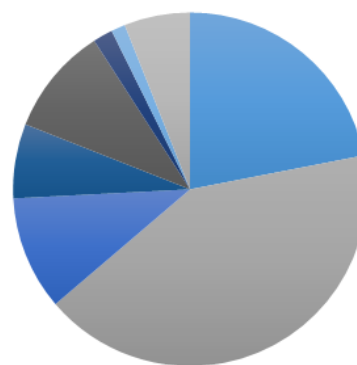

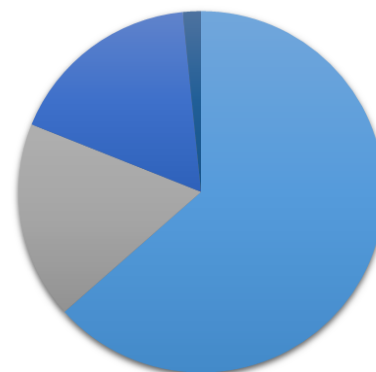
