PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Highlights

- All adopted children are one year or older at the time of referral.
- CAS has been working in Haiti for over 10 years.
- CAS specializes in relative adoptions from Haiti.

Children

- Age 1+ at the time of referral
- Sibling groups
- Children of all ages with special needs

Ecuador Intercountry Adoption Requirements

- Marital Status: Married couples or single men/women
- Age: 25+; One parent must be at least 30, both parents under the age of 50
- Single women: 35-50 years of age

The Wait to Welcome Home

- Dossier to Referral: 5-6 years; Relative Adoptions:
 1-2 years
- Referral to Final Trip: 12-20 months due to Covid-19

Excited to Travel

- 1st Trip: 2 weeks (completed virtually due to Covid-19)
- 2nd Trip: 3-5 days











PROGRAM OVERVIEW EXPLAINED

THE CHILDREN

Children available for adoption in Haiti are aged 1 year or older at the time of referral, sibling groups, older children (6+), and children with special needs. Children reside in accredited orphanages called crèches.

THE PROGRAM

Haiti is a member of the Hague convention. The central adoption authority, IBESR, matches children with approved families. Families receive considerable information about a referred child, including a medical, social, and developmental report, photos, and information about the birth family (if known). The extent of information provided may vary among crèches. Depending on the policies in place at the child's crèche and travel restrictions, families may be able to make additional bonding trips once matched with a child.

IBESR evaluates and accredits all international adoption service providers every two years and issues approvals to work in the country of Haiti.

THE PROCESS

With the help of our in-country partners, CAS submits dossiers to IBESR for approval and match with a child. Families will be invited to do a virtual socialization trip due to Covid-19 and travel restrictions instead of an in country 2-week bonding period. Currently due to travel restrictions families make one trip at the end of the adoption process. Families will be able to leave the country with their adopted child. In some cases, parents will fly into Haiti and are met at the airport by an in-country representative with the child. In recent cases due to travel restrictions and safety concerns, adoptive families have not left the airport and immediately fly out of Haiti the same day with their child.
